What Changed in the Tax Package

On Thursday (4/29), the Senate adopted an amendment to the House tax package (HB 7061). The bill is set for a vote in the Senate tomorrow and it will have to go back to the House. Here is what has changed from the original House and Senate tax bills.

Out:

- Reauthorization of the Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Program (Senate provision). Florida TaxWatch strongly supported the program's reauthorization.
- A property tax exemption for the Homestead-Miami Speedway. (Senate provision)
- A property tax exemption for structures and equipment used in aquaculture. (House provision)
- Expansion of the authorized used of Tourist Development and Convention Development taxes and a required that TDTs must be approved by the voters (House provision). Florida TaxWatch opposes expansion of the use of TDT revenue.

Added:

- A one-time increase in the annual cap on the corporate income tax credit for voluntary cleanup of contaminated sites from \$18.5 million to \$27.5 million.
- Implementing language for the proposed constitutional amendment (HJR 1377) that will, if approved by the voters, exempt improvements made to residential property to increase resistance to flood damage. The joint resolution has already passed both chambers, sending it to the November 2022 ballot.
- An increase in the distribution of cigarette tax revenues to the H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center and Research Institute. For the next three years, Moffitt's share will increase from \$15.5 million to \$26.9 million. After that, and until 2054, the share will increase to \$38.4 million annually.

Changes in the Sales Tax Holidays:

Back to School – The holiday will last 10 days (July 31 to August 9). The House proposed seven days and the original Senate proposals was eight days.

Disaster Preparedness – The holiday will last ten days (May 28 to June 6). The House proposed seven days. The Senate amendment also increased the price limits for most of the exempt items and added one item. The exempt items and there old/new price limits: flashlights and portable light sources (\$20/\$40); portable radios, including two-way and weather radios (\$50/\$50), ground anchors or tiedown kits (\$50/\$100), fuel tanks (\$25/\$50), packages of batteries (\$30/\$50), nonelectric coolers (\$30/\$60), portable generators (\$75/\$1,000) and reusable ice (\$10/\$20). For the first time, portable power banks (\$60) will be exempt.
